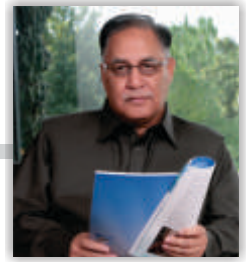

Dr. Zaheer Ahmad (late) was a visionary, social entrepreneur and philanthropist whose work in the healthcare and education sector had a compounding impact on our society. After studying and acquiring expertise abroad, Dr. Zaheer returned to Pakistan to "repay his debt" to his homeland. Transforming his visions into "actions", he founded both Shifa International Hospitals, Ltd. (SIH) and Tameer-e-Millat Foundation (TMF) in 1987.

SIH: Operational since 1993, under Dr. Zaheer's leadership, Shifa grew to be a leading reputable state-of-the-art tertiary healthcare facility.

TMF: He named the foundation Tameer-e-Millat, meaning Building a Nation - borne of the strongly held belief that education was the only solution for

all problems plaguing our country. By investing in education, he believed Pakistan would one day be amongst the top nations of the world. Under his guidance and expertise, TMF grew from a single pilot school in Khewra to over 228 educational institutions all across Pakistan.

In recognition of Dr. Zaheer Ahmad's legacy, the Government of Pakistan awarded him posthumous Sitara-e-Imtiaz. Other awards include Overseas Pakistanis Institute Award, Expatriate Achievement Award, Cosmo Gold Medallion Award by Rotary Club of Islamabad, and a Gold Medal Award by Nazriya-e-Pakistan.

He will be remembered for his passion, kindness and a vision that continues to inspire us all.

3. Village women were also made skillful through DAE in Dress Designing and Making in TMIT Fateh Jang. They were also provided respectable job opportunities in Industrial Home.

My sincere thanks to my fellow board members for their guidance and support, to the TMF staff for their tireless efforts, and to our partners for their cooperation and inspiration. We hope that you will continue to support our cause and take an active role in our projects.

Vice Chairperson **Message**

TMF believes in empowering women in order to power our future generations. Only 40% of Pakistani women over the age of 15 can read and write, compared to 70% of men. There can be no significant or sustainable transformation in societies and no significant reduction in poverty until girls receive the quality basic education they need to take their rightful place as equal partners in development. Therefore, TMF in its efforts to address severe challenges that are currently plaguing women's rights in Pakistan, has stepped forward, accelerating the spread of education amongst women and in narrowing down the male female gender disparity in education which has been so severe for decades.

1. More than 55% of the students are girls in all TMF run community schools. If we focus on the Mardan Region in KPK, 70% are girls studying in 76 Community Primary Schools.
2. All five TMF colleges (Three Intermediate and two Degree colleges) situated in the rural areas of Punjab and KPK offer tertiary education for girls. These institutes are the only option for girls to get a college education in the community.

3. TMF has helped create more than 1,000 respectable job opportunities to the village women across the Pakistan.

TMF sees itself as a catalyst of change but the real work lies ahead with all parties coming together to pursue outcomes where no child and women is denied their fundamental right of education.

The key to truly making a difference in our community lies within each of us. Join us in becoming catalysts for community change.

You can honor Dr. Zaheer Ahmad (late) by embracing his enduring values and the continuing work of Tameer-e-Millat Foundation which he founded. I respectfully ask your help in keeping my beloved father's legacy alive by becoming a donor.

I look forward to working with all our friends, past, present and future on this important journey.

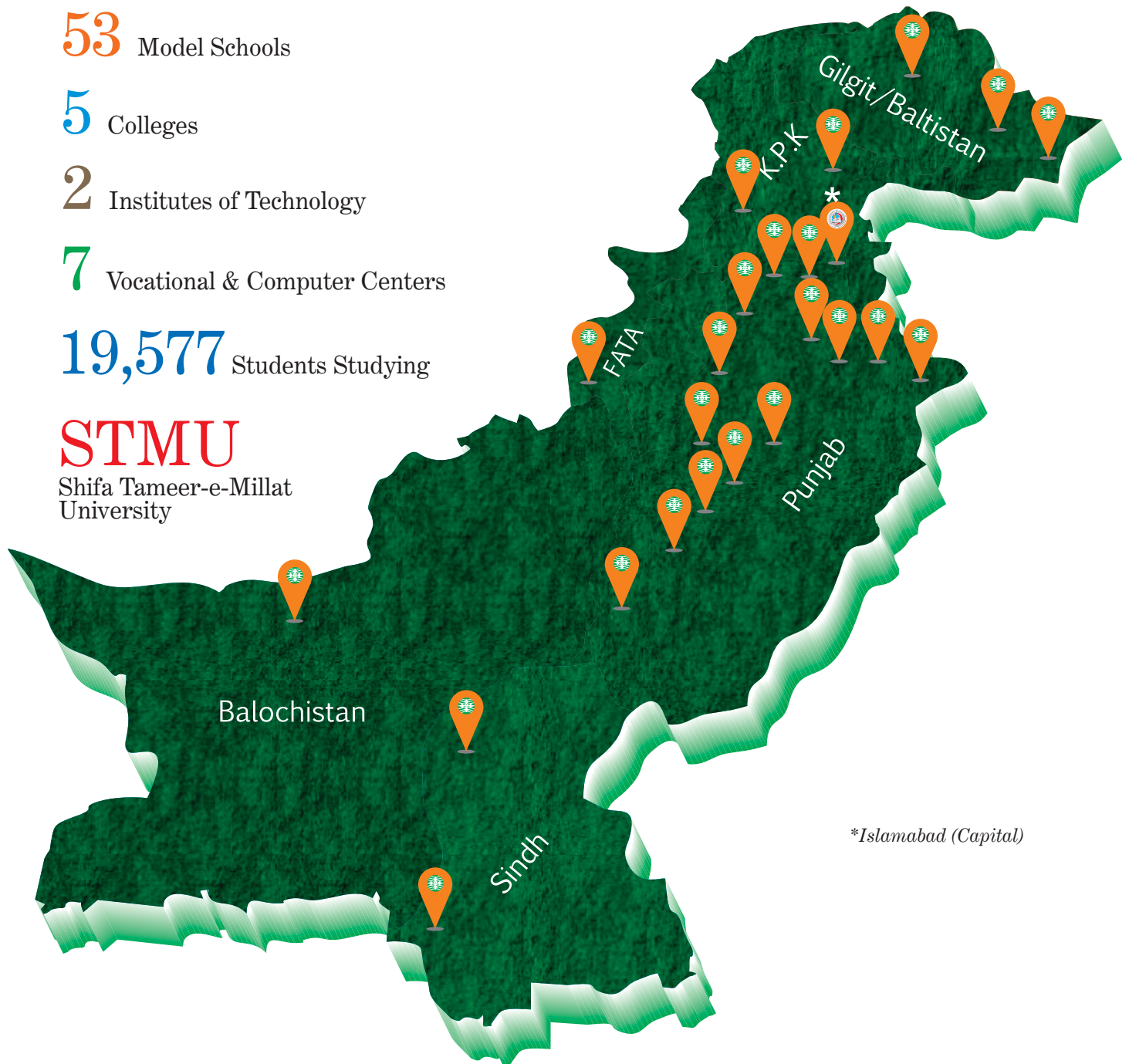

2014 HIGHLIGHTS

Addition of 3 New Schools

Maria Helena TM Primary School, Dandka

The Maria Helena TM Primary School was started in Phalia, Mandi Bahauddin on February 10, 2014. Dr. Ahmad Tarrar donated 10 kanals of land whereas the construction was sponsored by The Maria Helena Foundation (MHF), Canada. The primary level school has 7 classrooms, 66 students and 07 teachers.



Tameer-e-Millat Model School Novatix, Landhi

Karachi Region started the TMMS Novatix in Landhi, Karachi. The opening ceremony was blessed with the participation of Abdul Razaq Dewan CEO Novatix Ltd and trustees of TMF Sindh chapter. The school has a Computer Lab and a Library with a total of 21 rooms. Currently, 350 students are getting education and 11 teachers are serving.



APPNA TM Primary School, Munirabad

The Association of Physicians of Pakistani Descent of North America transferred the management of the APPNA Primary School, Munirabad, District Muzaffargarh to TMF. Renamed as APPNA TM Primary School, it was built after the 2010 floods on 1 kanal land & consists of 5 classrooms & an office. 175 students (85 boys & 90 girls) are enrolled. Staff includes 4 teachers & a principal. Students receive free education along with free books & uniform. A water filtration plant provides clean drinking water to the students.



In-service Teachers' Training

Since its establishment in 1987, TMF has organized 250 Teacher training programs and seminars which have proved to be vital for the professional development of about 4,000 teachers. In June 2014, TMF organized a 3 day teachers' training program at TMCE, Ratwal, Fateh Jang. Teachers from TMF schools in Khewra, Daryala Jalip, Pind Dadan Khan, Lilla, Jethal, Chawinda, Thoha Khalsa, Tarlai Kalan, Islamabad, Dhandka and TMCE attended the session.



Achievement – 40 Tameerian claimed laptops

The Government of Punjab has awarded laptops to the bright students of TMF who secured 75% or above marks in the 2013 Punjab Board Examinations. 40 students from TMMS for Boys and Girls in Khewra, Dharyala Jalip, Pind Dadan Khan, Lilla Town, Mian Channu, Bhoaman Bath, Mitha Tiwana, Multan, and from School of Excellence were awarded.



The Al-Huda Teachers Education Centre (ATEC) served as the training provider. The participants of the course were very enthusiastic about improving and learning new teaching skills and techniques. The interactive training session encouraged active participation hence increasing effectiveness. TMF is determined to continue In-service Teachers training in order to equip the teachers with the latest developments in teaching skill methods. The teachers were hopeful about their performance in the future as they pledged to improve their way of teaching in the light of latest learnt techniques.

Non-Formal Education

Community Primary Schools

Availability and access to basic education is a fundamental human right. Due to the inadequacies of the formal structured education system to provide knowledge and skills at an affordable cost, Non-Formal Education (NFE) is a cheaper alternative means to provide school going aged children with learning skills.

Since 1996, almost 8,500 students have graduated from TM community schools based in Jhelum, Khushab, Rawal Pindi, Islamabad, Fateh Jang, and Mardan. These schools offer free primary education and are built on the concept of single teacher – single room school. Currently, there are 168 TM community schools.

My teachers taught me so well that I found the later stages of learning quite easy. That one room school built my life. ”

Model School and Colleges

Not only literacy is the goal. Educating every nation on professional grounds is also important so that experts in multiple disciplines may be produced. Poor education and unskilled labor is also an important contributor the increased unemployment. TMF has moved a step forward from not only bring education accessible at higher and secondary level to the community. Science labs, Computer labs, plying areas, and well equipped libraries make our intuitions as model institutions; which are established in the under privileged communities. Currently there are 13,566 students getting education form all TMF model schools and colleges.



Computer Training Centers

Computer literacy is now necessary for every individual. In cities, youth has enough opportunities to get computer education. Whereas under privileged and undeveloped rural areas lack the opportunity. Majority of rural qualified individuals fail to get a respectable job simply because of not knowing and possessing computer skills.

TM Computer institutes in Jehlum and Skardu are filling the gap by providing opportunities to the rural youth.



Vocational and Technical Training Institutes

Unfortunately, a majority of the youth cannot continue their studies at a higher level because of financial constraints and job unemployment. This segment of the youth needs to be equipped with technical and vocational skills so that they may become self-reliable and economically stable.

The TM Institute of Technology, TMCE offers a 3 year Diploma in Associate Engineering (DAE) in Civil, Electrical, Electronics and Critical Health Care Technology. In order to impart income generating skills to rural women, DAE in Dress Designing and Making (DDM) is also offered. These female graduates are then offered jobs in the TM Industrial Home where they can earn money by making uniforms and hospital wears.

Vocational centers have also been set up so that the rural women and girls of Attock, Jhelum, Khushab, and Multan can be empowered through skills such as embroidery.

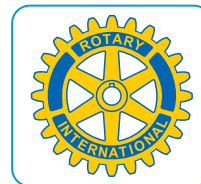

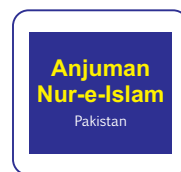
